

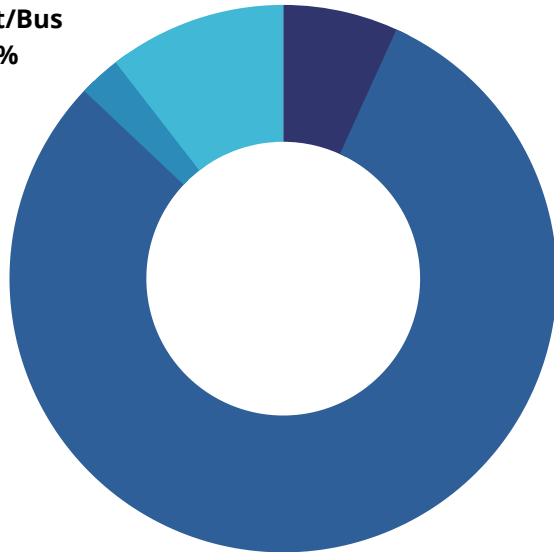
PARTNERSHIPS TO END HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN LAS VEGAS
