

IMPACT IN ACTION

Coalition Builds inspire leaders from trucking companies, truck stops, bus companies, public transit agencies, energy companies, transportation associations, government agencies and law enforcement agencies to act, while equipping them with the practical tools they need to become force multipliers in the antihuman trafficking movement.

Since the El Paso Coalition Build:

- The Texas Office of the Governor has pledged to cohost an energy-focused Coalition Build with TAT in Midland, Texas in early 2024.
- Love's Travel Stop truck stops displayed TAT materials at eight locations in El Paso.
- Pilot Flying J pledged to train employees and distribute TAT materials throughout their locations in El Paso.
- The El Paso Human Trafficking Task Force has strengthened their partnership with two agencies in attendance and is hopeful for future collaborations.

- The El Paso County Sheriffs Office requested to participate on the El Paso Human Trafficking Task Force.
- The El Paso Juvenile Probation
 Department trained six
 employees with TAT's state
 agency webinar.
- El Paso Public Works Planning and Development have committed to connect TAT's Busing on the Lookout program with the leadership at El Paso County Transit.
