

IMPACT IN ACTION

- California State Assembly
 District 77 trained 9 staff with
 TAT's state agency webinar and
 toolkit and plans to highlight
 TAT in an upcoming newsletter.
- San Diego Metro Transit System requested TAT's BOTL training for their entire Code Compliance Department.
- San Diego City Attorney's Office has integrated TAT's Addressing Demand, Man to Man video in their court ordered Sex Trafficking Education and Prevention Program.

- The San Diego Human
 Trafficking and CSEC Advisory
 Council has agreed to promote
 TAT's NHTAM engagement
 toolkit during the month of
 January.
- County of San Diego Supervisor Joel Anderson presented TAT with a certificate of recognition for our dedication and contribution to preserving public safety and promoting freedom.
- Several attendees have initiated discussions regarding CDL legislation to mandate human trafficking training.
