TAT Coalition Builds **create pathways** for strategic engagement as stakeholders come together to leverage their networks in the fight against human trafficking. At the event, TAT provided **targeted action steps** and **free resources** for attendees to use within their companies and agencies with a specific focus on protecting youth from trafficking and exploitation.



TAT has and will continue to follow-up with attendees from the Coalition Build in order to help facilitate lasting connections and build strategies for combating human trafficking locally.

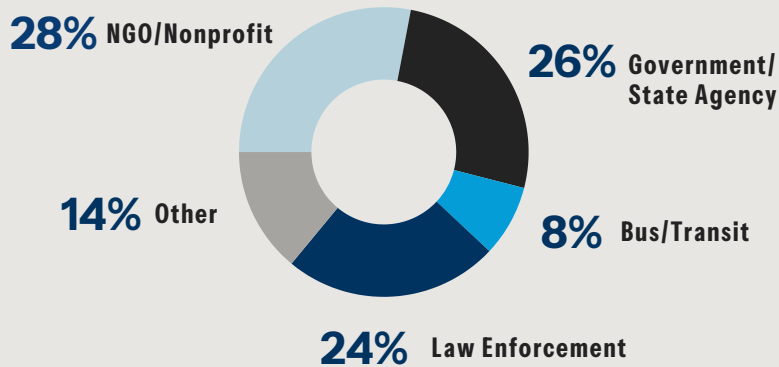

IMPACT BY NUMBERS

- **89%** of respondents said their knowledge about human trafficking increased.
- **89%** of respondents said they were better prepared to identify human trafficking.

IMPACT IN ACTION

Coalition Builds inspire leaders from trucking companies, truck stops, bus companies, public transit agencies, energy companies, transportation associations, government agencies and law enforcement agencies to act, while equipping them with the practical tools they need to become force multipliers in the anti-human trafficking movement.

Since the Denver, CO Coalition Build:

- ✓ The Denver District Attorney's Office and Denver Police Department will implement TAT's Law Enforcement Training Modules for investigators and officers. The Denver DA has also invited TAT to their 2024 Fall Symposium.
- ✓ Denver RTD has included anti-trafficking messaging from TAT and the Colorado Human Trafficking Council on their public-facing electronic monitors. RTD also distributed information to all 3,000+ employees, in addition to print materials to frontline employees.
- ✓ Fountain-Fort Carson School District 8, Cherry Creek Schools, Clear Creek Schools and Salida Public Schools have all trained or pledged to train their school transportation staff with TAT materials.
- ✓ Mountain Metropolitan Transit will train employees with TAT materials and display TAT's Youth-focused awareness materials.
- ✓ The Colorado Department of Revenue is displaying TAT messaging on DMV TV monitors.
- ✓ TAT was invited to present at a virtual meeting of the Colorado School Transportation Consortium.
- ✓ The Colorado School Safety Resource Center will include TAT materials in their resource guide for schools.
