TAT Coalition Builds **create pathways** for strategic engagement as stakeholders come together to leverage their networks in the fight against human trafficking. At the event, TAT provided targeted action steps and free resources for attendees to use within their companies and agencies with a specific focus on protecting youth from trafficking and exploitation.

TAT has and will continue to follow-up with attendees from the Coalition Build in order to help facilitate lasting connections and build strategies for combating human trafficking locally.

### IMPACT IN ACTION

Coalition Builds inspire leaders from trucking companies, truck stops, bus companies, public transit agencies, energy companies, transportation associations, government agencies and law enforcement agencies to act, while equipping them with the practical tools they need to become force multipliers in the anti-human trafficking movement.

#### Since the San Joaquin Coalition Build:

- San Joaquin County Office of Education will share information about TAT's school transportation resources with all school districts.
- Linden Unified School District committed to implementing TAT training for their transportation staff.
- Tracy Transit has expressed interest in displaying victim-centered materials.
- The San Joaquin County Regional Rail Commission has committed to implementing training for employees and equipping train crew and station staff with TAT's transit wallet cards/app.

- San Joaquin County Office of Education and San Joaquin Family Justice Center are interested in hosting a follow-up virtual event with all attendees to continue the conversation and strengthen partnerships.
- Our co-hosts are continuing to work together, having partnered on several occasions, including events for Sexual Assault Awareness Month and National Crime Victims' Rights Week.
