Individuals

- Educate yourself on the issue of human trafficking by checking out TAT's Community Resources page at <u>www.tatnonprofit.org/community-</u> <u>resources</u>.
- Get involved with local organizations making an impact in your community. Organizations that support food or housing insecurity, after school or mentorship programs for kids or similar organizations help buffer against trafficking, even though they're not anti-trafficking in name.
