

SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS: BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING!

LOOK FOR STUDENTS WHO:

- have begun to accumulate frequent absences
- demonstrate changes in moods, such as irritability or panic
- have new gadgets, clothes, etc. that a trafficker may have given them during the grooming process
- are dressed inappropriately for the weather or school
- show bruising, physical trauma, signs of branding/tattooing
- mention having an older boyfriend, pimp or sugar daddy, needing to make a quota
